HURRICANE RELIEF NEEDED FOR GUATEMALA & OTHERS IN CENTRAL AMERICA

SUMMARY:

AMERICAS RELIEF TEAM IS BEING ACTIVATED TO RESPOND TO CRITICAL RELIEF AID FOR GUATEMALA AND OTHER COUNTRIES IN CENTRAL AMERICA.

ACTION:

AMERICAS RELIEF TEAM MEMBERS AND COLLABOTRATORS ARE BEING ASKED TO COORDINATE THEIR EFFORTS TO HELP PROVIDE EMMERGENCY RELIEF IN EFFECTIVE WAYS TO THOSE WITH THE GREATEST NEEDS.

210 people have been confirmed dead in floods and mudslides in Central America and southern Mexico in the last few days in the wake of Tropical Storm Stan. Rain-sodden hills collapsed throughout the region. Most of the dead were peasants, many of whom had lived in wooden and tin shacks.

Guatemala confirmed 119 deaths and said the toll would rise. At least 65 people were dead in <u>El Salvador</u>, 13 in Mexico, 10 in <u>Nicaragua</u> and 3 in <u>Honduras</u>.

Soldiers across Central America and southern Mexico tried to reach flooded areas with drinking water, food and medical kits, but relentless rain and washed-out roads made it difficult. Meteorologists predicted the rain would continue for the rest of the week. The flooding came from storms set off by the hurricane, which hit Mexico from the Atlantic early this week.

Flooding cut off dozens of fishing villages on Guatemala's Pacific coast, and another potentially deadly mudslide was reported Thursday at the Tacamulco volcano near Mexico.

Here is a summary by region:

El Salvador: In the worst-affected country of El Salvador, nearly 55,000 people are currently being housed in 370 temporary shelters around the country. At

least 65 people have died and an estimated 540,000 people – about 10% of the population – have been seriously affected by the floods.

Mexico: Major damage from Hurricane/Tropical Storm Stan – adding to damage caused by two previous hurricanes, Rita and Otis – has been inflicted on the states of Chiapas (over 200,000 people affected), Veracruz (38,000 people affected) and Oaxaca, with significant destruction in the states of Guerrero, Tabasco, Campeche, Yucatan and Quintana Roo. Up to now, over 480 municipalities have been affected, with about 800,000 to 1 million persons affected. Eleven deaths have been recorded, while an estimated 110 people have been injured. More than 280,000 people have been displaced, and approximately 2,200 houses have been totally destroyed, while 6,000 houses have been partially destroyed.

Guatemala: In Guatemala, floods have killed at least 119 people so far, mostly in landslides. Approximately 38,000 people are affected by flooding in more than 194 communities, where nearly 4,000 houses have been destroyed and more than 12,000 residents have been evacuated.
